Hinamatsuri(Doll's Festival) is an occasion to pray for young girls' growth and happiness. Hinamatsuri is celebrated each year on March 3. Most families with girls display dolls for the Doll's Festival called Hinaningyo.

The dolls depict the imperial court. A set of dolls includes the Emperor(odairi-sama), the Empress (ohina-sama), three court ladies(sannin-kanjo), five court musicians (gonin-bayashi), the minister of the left(sadaijin), the minister of the right(udaijin) and three servants (sannin-jougo).

Today, we eat traditional dishes like Scattered sushi (chirashi-sushi), clam soup, sweet white sake(shirozake), rise cake cubes(hina arare) and diamond-shaped rice cakes(hishimochi) for the Doll's Festival.

Interesting Goods —YAMAKI Dashi Soup Bag

"Washoku", Japanese cuisine, is becoming more popular as it is low in calories and healthy.

"Dashi", soup stock, is the basis of Washoku. It does not sound nice to rely only on chemical seasoning.

But it is too much bother for many people to make Dashi (soup stock) from dried bonito and kombu at home every day.

A "Dashi Pack", a bag that looks like a tea bag, which contains several blended materials is favored among consumers because you can easily make genuine Dashi.

YAMAKI in Iyo City started selling "Katsuobushi-ya no ajiwai dashi" packs last August. It is a blend of four different characteristic ingredients such as dried bonito, kombu, dried ago (a small fish) and others. In addition it is flavored with seasoning to bring out the "Umami" of Dashi. You can make soup stock by using it and you can cook good vegetables or Takikomi-gohan (rice cooked in stock with various ingredients) just by adding some seasoning.


The price is \572 (manufacture's suggested retail price). One plastic bag contains 10 individual Dashi packs.
