A:Bさん、もう 元気に なったの?

B-san, mõ genki ni natta no? (B-san, are you better now?)



B: うん、病院で 薬を もらったし、ゆっくり 寝たから 大丈夫。

Un, byōin de kusuri o moratta shi, yukkuri neta kara daijōbu. (Yes, I got some medicine from the hospital and got a good night's sleep, so I'm fine.)

Namaste & Konnichiha!

Krish Maharjan

Hello, everyone. Namaste & Konnichiha! I am Krish Maharjan from Kathmandu Nepal. I have been living here Niihama from last year and working in Kowa cooperation. Its great pleasure to me to introduce about my country Nepal. Have you heard about Nepal? Where is it located?

Nepal is a landlocked country in South Asia and is bordered by China & India. It is located in the Himalayas & India. It contains eight of the world's ten highest peaks including Mt. Everest. The government system is federal parliaments republic; the chief of state is the president, and the head of government is the prime minister. Capital is the Kathmandu.

Nepal has a diverse geography, including fertile plains, subalpine forested hills and multi-ethnic, multi-lingual, religious and cultural state, with Nepali as the official language. Nepal has 126 cast and ethnic groups speaking as many as 123 languages.

Do you know the flag of Nepal? Yup our national flag is double Rectangle Red & Blue colors and Sun and Moon. Red is the symbol of bravery and it also represents the color of the

rhododendron, Nepal's national flower, while the blue border is the color of peace and Harmony. The flag's emblems, both the sun and the crescent moon represent peace and hard work, using the symbols of the moon and sun respectively. The inclusion of celestial bodies indicates Nepal's permanence and the hope that Nepal will enjoy the same longevity as the Sun and the Moon. The moon also symbolizes the cool weather of the Himalayas, whereas the sun symbolizes the heat and the high temperature of the southern lowlands (Terai.) Additionally, the stylized moon represents the calm demeanor and purity of spirit of Nepali people, while the stylized sun represents their fierce resolve. During ancient times, the flags of almost all states in South Asia were triangular. Nepal has simply maintained its ancient tradition, while every other state has adopted a rectangular or square version in the European vexillological tradition.

Nepal is very small country and ranked as the $93^{\rm rd}$ largest country in the world. Japan is about 2.6 times bigger than Nepal. Nepal is a roughly rectangular country with an area of 147,181 sq km, while Japan is approximately 377,915 sq km, making Japan 157% larger than Nepal. Meanwhile, the population of Nepal is ~ 30.3 million people (95.2 million more people live in Japan.) We have positioned the outline of Nepal near your home location of Sapporo in Japan. Nepal is 62.1% cheaper than Japan.

Kathmandu Valley





Kathmandu Valley is the central capital of Nepal, which is situated at an altitude of 1336 meters above sea level and covers an area of 218 Square Miles. Kathmandu Valley comprises the three ancient cities of Kathmandu, Pata and Bhaktapur, which were once independent states ruled by the Malla Kings from the 12th to 18th centuries. The three cities are the house of seven UNESCO World Heritage Site. The valley is also home to more than hundreds of other exquisite monuments, sculptures, artistic temple and magnificent art reminders of the golden era in Nepal's Architecture.

Mandatory Microchip Implants in Pet Dogs & Cats

(Monthly City News of June, 2022)

Under the revised Law on Welfare and Management of Animals, implanting a microchip in pet dogs and cats sold at breeders and pet shops is mandatory from June 1, 2022. Those who already have dogs and cats are advised to do so, though there is no penalty if they don't. In other words, every dog and cat you buy will have an implanted microchip that must be registered to mark the change of ownership. If you'd like to implant a microchip in your pet dog or cat, go to your veterinary clinic and have them do the implant. Following that, register your pet with the Japan Veterinary Medical Association. Later you will receive a registration certificate.



The merit of implanted microchip in your pet dog or cat

If your pet dog or cat goes missing from your home or while taking a walk and the city office or the police station have them, their microchip shows the name of their owner. This will allow more stray pet dogs and cats to return to their owners. During natural disasters, many pets are separated from their owners. Why not prepare for a possible disaster in advance?
